2017-18 Behavior Education Plan Data Report Supplement

This report serves as a review of the action steps taken at the close of the 2017-18 school year and through the summer of 2018, including progress made on implementation plans and action steps in support of the Behavior Education Plan. This is a supplement to the data review of behavior incidents from the 2017-18 school year.

Implementation Progress

- Prioritized school decision-making through Culture and Climate funding by making \$100,000 in Behavior Education Plan funds available to support schools. Schools submitted proposals on how they would use funds. Some of the projects included:
 - West High School launching Start on Time to address tardiness
 - Leopold Elementary focusing on social emotional learning by pulling together a team for summer-long planning in developing systems of support for students
 - Many schools using funds to offer extended employment to staff for continuous planning that carried through the summer
- Provided trainings for mobile response teams to improve implementation of proactive systems and specific policies, such as Act 143, Board of Education Policy 4400 and the new procedures for fighting/physical attack. This ensured system alignment to policies.
- Engaged a new cohort of schools in restorative practice while deepening learning for previous cohorts and maintaining our partnership with the YWCA. Expansion of YWCA allocation to support for Badger Rock Middle School began in September 2018.
- Analyzed data related to lower level violations of the Behavior Education
 Plan and reviewed the intersection of bullying and harassment in relation
 to refusing to cooperate and repeated classroom disruptions.
- Held trainings and institutes related to Developmental Designs, Welcoming Schools, Restorative Practices, Mindfulness and Social Emotional Learning to further develop school team capacity to support universal systems.
